



Financial support for DHM and adh-Open through university sport

1) Entry fee

100% of the entry fee is paid by university sports.

2) Contrition fee

In case of unexcused absence, 100% of the contrition fee must be paid by the participant(s). In the event of illness, a medical certificate must be submitted to university sports directly before or after the event. In this case, university sports will bear the cost of the fee to the organiser.

3) Travel expenses

- 1) Provision of university sports 9-seater (Mercedes Sprinter) or university sports car (Hyundai i30 estate car). Fuel costs remain 100% with the participants
- 2) Use of a RUB vehicle. Fuel costs remain 100% with the participants.
- 3) Use of a private vehicle: In principle, 50% of the fuel costs incurred are reimbursed (only if the vehicles are used to capacity).
- 4) In some cases, university sports will cover the cost of train tickets on a pro rata basis. In this case, participants must contact university sports before booking a ticket in order to clarify the amount of the subsidy.

4) Accommodation

If the organiser offers overnight accommodation (e.g. in a sports hall or classrooms), each participant receives $5 \in \text{per night}$. If the organiser does not offer accommodation, each participant will receive a maximum grant of &15 per night.

If the announcement of the event makes the application of the rules too complicated (e.g. by "package offers" for accommodation and meals together), the university sports will decide on a possible individual solution.

5) Board

Each participant will receive a food allowance of 5 \oplus per day of competition.

6) Miscellaneous

Additional expenses for event clothing (T-shirts), Players Party or similar will not be subsidised. Each DHM participant will receive a functional shirt from university sports, which can be used as a warm-up shirt and for photos.
